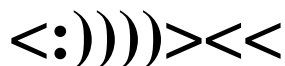

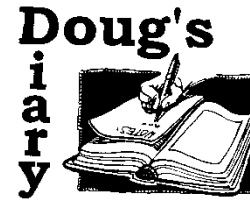

In an issue of Harper's magazine a couple of years ago, there was an interesting article entitled, "IF'S." It was an article which speculated upon what the world would be like if certain things had or had not

happened. For instance, what if the South had won the Civil war,... how would this nation's history be different? What if Lee Harvey Oswald had missed in Dallas in 1963? What if Judas had changed his mind and not left the supper on Maundy Thursday?

The "What-If" questions posed in that article are interesting to ponder, even though there is no way to answer any of them with certainty.

In the church, my sense is that "What-If" questions usually have a negative twist to them. What if our congregation can't pay its bills? What if we end up the year with no money in the bank? (As a matter of fact, Calvary ended up on December 31, 2009 with almost a quarter of a million dollars in the bank!) What if we can't find enough leaders (i.e. elders, deacons, teachers) to carry on the work of the church?

Here are some "What-if's" I came up with (as you may notice, they have a positive twist rather than a negative one):


- What if we used the upcoming Lenten Season to read one chapter per day from the gospels? (The 16 chapters of Mark and the 24 chapters of Luke give us 40 chapters...one for each of the 40 days of Lent.) What if this were our Lenten discipline?
- What if we shared with a non-church attender or non-believing friend or neighbor some of the good things happening here at Calvary? What if we invited that person to one of our Easter Sunday worship services or another worship service?
- What if we looked for an opportunity each day to commit at least one random act of kindness?
- What if we woke up each morning saying "Good morning, Lord!" rather than "Good Lord, it's morning!"?

- What if our focus during the Lenten were on what we are taking on rather than what we are giving up?
- What if each Calvary member contributed \$10.00 to the Calvary Foundation...or the One Great Hour of Sharing...or the Capital Improvement Fund...or the Hunger & Local Mission Fund? (That would total \$4,610.00 if everyone gave to the same fund?)
- What if all of the members of our Calvary worshipping community became part of another church activity in addition to the Sunday morning worship service?
- What if we were intentional about putting into practice Jesus' words from the Sermon on the Mount to be peacemakers (not just peace-hoppers, peace-lovers, peace-talkers, or peace-prayers)?
- What if we committed ourselves to taking better care of ourselves this year...spiritually, physically, and emotionally?
- What if we worked in such a way that some of these "What-Ifs" were translated into reality? What if these "What-If"s become "What-Is"s?
- What if you came up with your own "What-If" list which is better than the one I just shared?

I'll see you in church!!

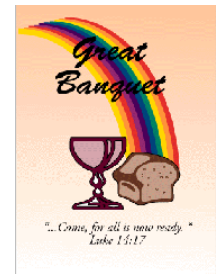
2010 FLOWER CHART

BACKPACK FOOD PROGRAM

The Backpack Food Program in Logansport began when two elementary school principals suggested that children from low-income families should be provided with additional food. The Backpack Food Program exists in other states and Logansport became part of the program. Calvary Presbyterian Women & Friends have donated peanut butter and wish to do it again.

The idea took off and beginning last school year, close to 250 Logansport children who qualify for the free and reduced price lunch program take home a bag of food on Friday and return the empty bag to the school on Monday so it is ready at the end of the week to be filled again. This is done for kindergarten thru 2nd grade children who qualify.

“Mr. Peanut Man” is in Bigler Hall Lobby again. If you can donate a 16 or 18 oz. jar of peanut butter, it will be great. When 100 jars are donated, CPW will match the 100 jars and donate them to the Backpack Food Program in Logansport.

There are some Calvary people who volunteer to fill the bags each week. Calvary Presbyterian Women have matched your gifts of 100 jars of peanut butter with 100 jars and given 200 jars to the school program twice so far. The total donated at this point is 400 jars, and CPW is now starting its 3rd drive. I understand it takes 200 to 250 to provide all the children with one jar of peanut butter placed in the backpack along with other nutritious food.

SUNDAY MORNING CLASSES

CHILDREN'S CHURCH at 9:45-10:30.

Immediately following the children's sermon, children in grades K-3 are invited to children's church. During this time basic Bible story videos are shown and lessons from those videos are held along with a short worship time for the children.

Sunday School for all ages meets each Sunday from 10:45-11:45 with the exception of the Early Riser's Class which meets at 8:15 a.m.-9:15 a.m. The following is a list of the different classes:

NURSERY – Infants up to Preschool. The nursery is also available during the worship service. Lisa Ervin is the attendant.

PRESCHOOL -KINDERGARTEN. The Beginners Bible study class is taught by Peggy Scott in the Preschool room on the lower level. This class is structured to introduce the youngest of God's children to His love.

GRADES 1-5 is held on the upper level immediately following Children's Church. Bible verses are read, basic Bible stories reviewed and activity based learning sessions held. Crafts, coloring, and games are interwoven into the Biblical stories.

CONFIRMATION CLASS – teacher is associate pastor, Jessica Wietzke. This class begins March 7 in the far end of Bigler Hall.

JR-HIGH SCHOOL/SR-HIGH SCHOOL – They are studying topical discussions. This class is being taught by Jeff Overway and Terry True.

EARLY RISER'S CLASS – They meet in the Library. This class is looking into church history and how it relates to today, and some myths in some religions and denominations. The teacher is Chuck Ross.

LECTIONARY CLASS – This class is for any age group and meets in the John Knox Room to study Sunday's Lectionary Bible passages. The teacher is Rev. Doug Mankell.

DROP-IN CLASS – taught by Beth and Dave Workman - This class is for any age group and meets in the Community Room next to the nursery. This class is now studying the Sunday sermons.

CONTEMPORARY CLASS - taught by Dave and Jo Reinking and meets in the upper level classroom.

ACRONYMS FOR LENT

(The following article was written by Rev. Candace Adams, pastor of Hope Presbyterian Church, Spicer, Minnesota.)

“The letter **“L” stands for love.** Love is central to the season of Lent. “For God so loved the world that he gave his only begotten Son that whosoever believes in him shall not perish but have everlasting life” (John 3:16). It was God’s immense love for humanity that moved him to surrender his only Son for the punishment of our sins. Love is God’s primary motivation toward humanity. As we journey to the cross, it is God’s love that offered forgiveness of sins. May you accept the love God has for you.

The next letter in Lent **“E” represents eternal.** The sacrifice Jesus Christ offered on our behalf is eternal. Hebrew 7:27 says, “Unlike the other high priests, he does not need to offer sacrifices day after day, first for his own sins, and then for the sins of the people. He sacrificed for their sins once for all when he offered himself.” Jesus Christ paid the penalty in full. He died that all people would be forgiven of their sins. Turn to God and confess your sins.

The letter **“N” in Lent refers to new beginnings.** If we confess our sins we are forgiven our sins and cleansed of our wrong doings. In 2 Corinthians 5:17 we read, “Therefore, if anyone is in Christ, he is a new creation; the old has gone, the new has come!” How much time and energy is spent on our past? As followers of Jesus, we are given new life. The old does not define us. We are new in God. This Lenten season may you embrace the new beginning God extends to you.

The final letter in Lent **“T” stands for thanks.** Lent is a perfect time to thank God for all the ways God blesses our lives. There are numerous Scriptures that instruct God’s people to give thanks. Psalm 118:19 declares, “Open for me the gates of righteousness; I will enter and give thanks to the LORD.” As Christians the ultimate reason for our thanks is the victory that Christ won on the cross. 1 Corinthians 15:57 states, “But thanks be to God! He gives us the victory through our Lord Jesus Christ.” This Lent may you know the love of God, the eternal nature of Christ’s sacrifice, the reality of a
