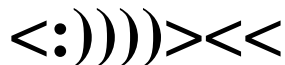

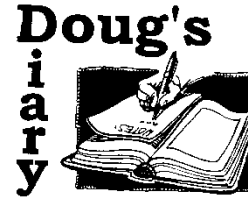

APRIL 2010

On Sunday, April 4, we will be privileged once again to celebrate the resurrection of Jesus Christ. "The Miracle of Easter" will be the theme of my sermon at both the 7:30 and 9:30 worship services that special morning. There will be flute music by Katy Baar at the 7:30 service, and the 9:30 service will feature the Chancel Choir, piano and organ duets and a trumpet trio. There will also be a breakfast served between services in Bigler Hall.

Easter is the oldest Christian festival. On the first day of the week, Jesus rose from the dead. This was the apex of Christian fact and devotion for the early Christians. Each Sunday for them was celebrated as a "little Easter". Eventually, the observance of the Resurrection on the first day of the week changed the day of worship from the Sabbath (Saturday) to the Lord's Day (Sunday).

But on which Sunday would it be celebrated? The issue was settled by the Council of Nicea in A.D. 325. All Christians were ordered to accept this date: "On the first Sunday after the full moon on or after the first day of Spring, March 21, or, if the full moon is on Sunday, the next Sunday after." Thus, Easter may fall between March 22 and April 25.

Easter is the Church's happy day. Like a mighty warrior, Christ came forth from the grave as victor on that glorious Easter morning. Christians express their joy over this victory of Christ and participate in His victory of faith. This note of victory is expressed in the seventeenth century Latin hymn: "The strife is o'er, the battle done; now is the Victor's triumph won..."

Yes, Easter has been a special day for Christians for centuries. Together with Christians around the world, it will be a special day for all of us who gather here at Calvary on April 4.

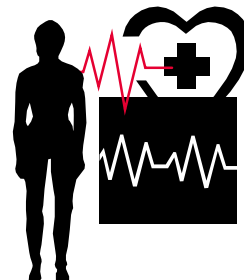
GREAT BANQUET WEEKENDS

SUNDAY MORNING CLASSES

CHILDREN'S CHURCH at 9:45-10:30.

Immediately following the children's sermon, children in grades K-3 are invited to Children's Church. During this time basic Bible story videos are shown and lessons from those videos are held along with a short worship time for the children.

Sunday School for all ages meets each Sunday from 10:45-11:45 with the exception of the Early Riser's Class which meets at 8:15 a.m.-9:15 a.m. The following is a list of the different classes:

NURSERY – Infants up to Preschool. The nursery is also available during the worship service. Lisa Ervin is the attendant.

PRESCHOOL -KINDERGARTEN. The Beginners Bible study class is taught by Peggy Scott in the Preschool room on the lower level. This class is structured to introduce the youngest of God's children to His love.

GRADES 1-5 is held on the upper level immediately following Children's Church. Bible verses are read, basic Bible stories reviewed and activity based learning sessions held. Crafts, coloring, and games are interwoven into the Biblical stories.

CONFIRMATION CLASS – teacher is Associate Pastor, Jessica Wietzke. This class meets in the far end of Bigler Hall.

JR-HIGH SCHOOL/SR-HIGH SCHOOL – They are studying topical discussions. This class is being taught by Jeff Overway and Terry True.

EARLY RISER'S CLASS – They meet in the Library. This class is looking into church history and how it relates to today, and some myths in some religions and denominations. The teacher is Chuck Ross.

CHILDREN'S SERMON GUIDELINES

The Worship Committee has these suggestions for those giving Children's Sermons on Sunday mornings:

1. Keep it short. The attention span of pre-schoolers is not much more than a minute or two, even under the best conditions. In view of this, the ideal length for a children's sermon is 2-4 minutes.
2. Keep it simple. A pre-schooler cannot handle multiple thoughts well. Better to make one point well than confuse them with two or three. A single point can be well made in that minute or two.
3. Avoid bribery. Toys and candy are appealing to tots, but should not be the focus or the reason for them to anticipate this time. Please insure that there is an underlying reason for presenting a gift.

The best Children's Sermons, like the adult versions, are those which leave them thinking about themselves, their actions toward others, and their relationship with God.

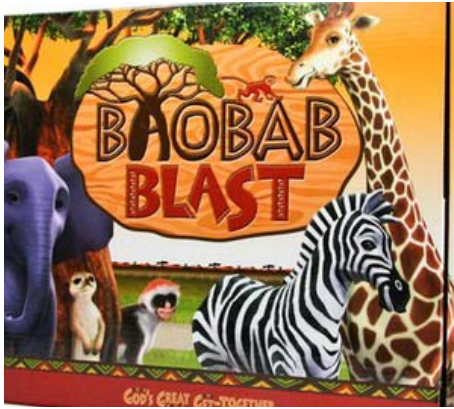
