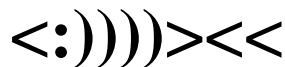

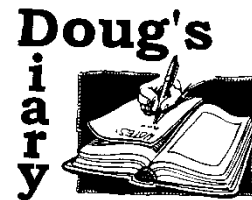



CHILDREN'S SERMON GUIDELINES

The Worship Committee has these suggestions for those giving Children's Sermons on Sunday mornings:

1. Keep it short. The attention span of pre-schoolers is not much more than a minute or two, even under the best conditions. In view of this, the ideal length for a children's sermon is 2-4 minutes.
2. Keep it simple. A pre-schooler cannot handle multiple thoughts well. Better to make one point well than confuse them with two or three. A single point can be well made in that minute or two.
3. Avoid bribery. Toys and candy are appealing to tots, but should not be the focus or the reason for them to anticipate this time. Please insure that there is an underlying reason for presenting a gift.

The best Children's Sermons, like the adult versions, are those which leave them thinking about themselves, their actions toward others, and their relationship with God.

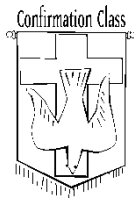

Some ways we "support women & children" with proceeds of Annual Plant Sale.

The time is growing near for CPW & Friends to have our annual plant sale. It will be held on the lower parking lot at Calvary on May 8, 2010, the Saturday before Mother's Day from 9:00 a.m. to 1:00 p.m.

We are hoping for great weather. In the past, we have been blessed with good weather – except for the very 1st sale-but we won't think about the rain on that 1st sale day.

We will have many types of perennial plants to sell – Iris, Day Lilies, Hostas and Chocolate Mint to name a few. This year there will be Redbud Trees as well as lots of ferns.

We would like you to know how we support "women & children" with the profits from the annual plant sale. Last year we sent two children to camp for a week and contributed to the expense of the Calvary Youth Mission trip in Kentucky.

We also had several projects for the benefit of children during the year. We provided several backpacks full of school supplies for each of the four Logansport Elementary Schools. These were given to the counselors of the schools to be available as needed during the school year. CPW delivered four gifts of food during the school summer vacation to the Salvation Army to help fill in the gap for families who were not receiving the "free lunch" available at the schools during the school year. Several gifts of Peanut Butter were provided as part of the foods given to schools for the "Backpack Food" program, which sends food home with qualifying children who may not have enough to eat at home.

We are also able to help support the Church Women United Food Cupboard and the Calvary Hunger & Local Mission Fund.

Please come on "Sale Day". It is a good fellowship day as well as providing income for some of our projects.

MISSION COMMITTEE NEWS

PRESBYTERIAN HERITAGE

In March 1837 Mary Longley Riggs and her new husband, Presbyterian minister, Stephen Return Riggs, set out from Massachusetts to take up their new posts as missionaries to the Dakota Indians. After a three month journey to Fort Snelling in present day St. Paul, Minnesota and a summer at the mission station on the banks of Lake Harriet, they headed almost due west to their new home at the Lac qui Parle Mission.



Stephen and Mary arrived two years after the American Board of Commissioners for Foreign Missions established this far western missionary outpost and a year after the organization of a Presbyterian church there with seven Native members.

Mary described their first Sabbath at Lac qui Parle in a September 1837 letter to her mother:

“Although the day was cold and stormy and much like November, 25 Indians and part Indians assembled at 11:00 a.m. in our school room for public worship. Excepting prayer, all the exercises were in Dakota and French, and most of them in the former. Could you have seen these Indians kneel in their own tongue led by one of their own tribe, your heart would have been touched.”

The ensuing decades brought much tumult as white settlers poured into Minnesota and the federal government sought to move the Dakota father west. Undeterred, Stephen and Mary Riggs spent the rest of their lives in Christian service to the Indians of the northern plains.

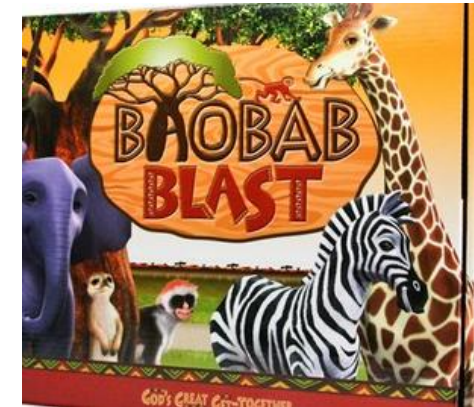
