Doug's Diary

January 2012

O.K. I admit it ...I really don't care much for numbers. Quite frankly, they bore me. I pay enough attention to numbers to get through life, but that's about it. I love ideas and concepts. However, I'm just not wired to be a "numbers guy."

Most of us have received by this time copies of Calvary's 2012 budget in the 2011 Annual Report. When I look at pages 35-37, I see a whole bunch of numbers which total \$434,730.30. My eyes glaze over and my attention wanders when I review all these numbers. Those row after row of numbers tend to induce drowsiness.

But then, I start looking closer at those numbers in the 2012 budget. I notice that a total of \$15,580.00 is budgeted for "**Electric and Water**" and for "**Fuel**". At first glance, these numbers don't excite me much. But then I realize that they translate into:

- The feel of a warm sanctuary in winter and a cool one in the summer.
- Lights in the church which help us to see what we're doing.
- Water to drink from water fountains and to use in the kitchen to operate our dishwasher.

As I continue to review the budget, I notice that \$15,580.00 is budgeted for "**Insurance and Fees**." At first glance, those numbers don't excite me. But then I realize that they translate into premiums to pay our insurance company which treated us generously when we submitted claims

over the past couple of years for lightning damage to our organ and fire alarm system as well as medical bills submitted for serious injuries sustained by a church friend who fell down the stairs outside the church office.

My eyes wander down to "**Benevolence/Mission**" which is budgeted for \$38,000.00. This translates into:

- Supporting the diverse mission programs of the General Assembly, Synod, and Presbytery.
- Assisting our youth with their mission trip to Kentucky in June.
- Helping provide vouchers for food, gasoline, and medical prescriptions for needy people in our congregation and community.

A large item in the budget is \$261,428.50 which is designated for "**Salaries and Benefits**." This translates into compensation for:

- Choir directors who direct the Chancel Choir and Celebration Choir.
- A custodian who keeps our church clean.
- A youth director who provides activities and events for our youth.
- A nursery attendant who cares for babies and children in our church nursery on Sunday mornings.
- A secretary who prepares bulletins and newsletters for the church.
- A financial secretary, who records contributions, pays bills...and keeps track of all those numbers!!
- Pastors who deliver sermons, teach lessons, and provide pastoral care.

And then there's "**Per Capita**" which is \$16,126.80. This translates into the cost of belonging to the Presbyterian Church (USA). Per Capita makes it possible for us to be connected to thousands of Presbyterian Church (USA) congregations across this country. Per Capita enables us to be part of a denominational structure which gives our congregation guidance and resources when necessary. We do not operate independently.

After reviewing all these numbers in the budget, I am still not converted to being a "numbers guy." But I will say this...when I think about what those numbers represent in the 2012 budget of Calvary Presbyterian Church, it gives me a certain amount of excitement which numbers ordinarily do not generate. In fact, those numbers even help me stay awake without the need for coffee!

One of my most memorable Lent disciplines was worshipping at the Easter Vigil at seminary in Princeton, NJ. It was a brief but meaningful breath that we soon-to-be pastors desperately needed during a busy week and looming finals. My friend and colleague, Rachel, who's an associate pastor in Bloomington, IN, recognized the need that pastors and churches needed to hit the pause button on the routine rollercoaster of life and ministry.

In the busyness of ministry, we didn't have time (I hope you see the irony here) to sit with darkness. To prepare for, confront, reflect on, and pray into the darkness - hidden, deceitful, divisive darkness in our world and also in my heart. I found the silence and the darkness disturbed me. Restlessly, impatiently, with fear, despair, and exhaustion (and just a little humility), we waited.

At last, the light came - the white Christ candle's flickering flame. Through fire, words, movement, and music, we journeyed as the people of God, following that "pillar of fire." We heard the overarching story of God's salvation, from our creation, our delivery from bondage in the Exodus, calling to faithfulness through the prophets, at last through Jesus Christ.

In the early church, this vigil culminated in a time for baptism for those students who'd studied for perhaps years to join the church. And at last, when new believers joined the body of Christ at the

break of dawn, believers celebrated a joyous feast of the people of God.

While I won't be suggesting this idea to welcome our next confirmation class, 7th and 8th graders will meet in Bigler starting February 5th to learn about the faith and God, to develop their relationship with God and one another. I apologize for not listing all the elder mentors for last year's confirmation class in the Annual Report. Confirmation Mentors included Shirley Bishop, Lola Van Dyke, Janet Bowyer, and Chris Williamson. Thank you to the mentors for their time, energy, and guidance!

One of the highlights of our worship service is the lighting of the candles by an acolyte. Then at the end of the service, the light of the world is taken from our sanctuary to be shared with the world. "Acolyte" is taken from an ancient Greek word that meant "companion", "attendant", or "helper." Later, it was considered one of the first steps to priesthood, and this is still the case in the Roman Catholic Church. Being an Acolyte can be seen as a first step of Confirmation for these young people. It is also an intentional effort to help our young people be part of the worship life of the church and understand that God desires their involvement.

Keeping watch, waiting for the dawn, sitting with darkness, are good Lent practices that can be kept all year. The Great Banquet has an intercessor praying at all times during the 72 hours that the banquet is held. Someone is always praying. People sign up to pray during all hours of the day. My roommate and

friends was Korean. They had the discipline of Morning Prayer, like at 4 or 5 in the morning; they started their day together with prayer. I found 6:30 a.m. in the chapel at seminary to be a stretch. But for them it was necessary, part of their faith life. I'm not saying that this made them super-Christians or that this will build them a couple stories on their house in heaven. However, there's something fundamental to our faith in the practice of prayer. In prayer, we build our relationship with God and one another; we are strengthened, renewed, and enlightened. And every week, before our Sunday morning worship, we pray for the service, for those who come to worship, for those in need of God's healing touch or a prophetic word. We pray around 9:00 a.m. in the library, so that choir members can go practice. And so we prepare our hearts and our lives for the Light that has come to this world and will come again, Jesus Christ, our Lord. May we have ears to hear and eyes to see. Come, Lord Jesus.

Confirmation Classes will be held in Bigler Hall at 10:45 a.m.-11:45 a.m. on Sunday mornings beginning February 5th, 2012.

Bring: a pen or pencil and your Bible (if you prefer to use your own).

We give all students an NRSV Bible at the beginning of class so that we're all literally on the same page and students can take the Bible with them to use the rest of their lives. You will also get a workbook that has readings, journal entries, class assignments, and lots of good stuff. Tuesday, May 15th, students meet with the Session. Students will then be confirmed on Sunday, May 20th at the 9:30a.m. worship service. If students haven't been baptized yet, they'll be baptized first and then confirmed during the worship service. Students will be commissioned on Sunday, February 12th at the 9:30 a.m. worship service.

Parents are invited to attend this first class on February 5th to get an over-view of the course and go over the expectations. I understand that it's Super Bowl Sunday, so I'm available after our Annual Meeting on Sunday, January 29th, in Bigler Hall. 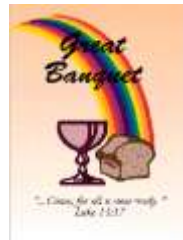

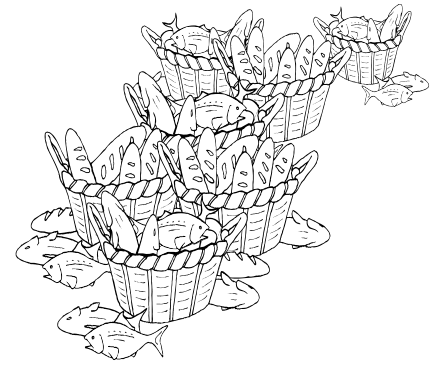
GREAT BANQUET WEEKENDS
