O, WORSHIP THE LORD IN THE BEAUTY OF HIS HOLINESS by Cindy Heinzman

Our team recently had a discussion about the differences between song leaders and worship leaders and we decided to share this with all of you.

There was a transition that took place in the church in the wake of the Charismatic movement and the Jesus movement that happened in the 1960's and 1970's. Prior to the Charismatic/Jesus movements, churches had song leaders with a primary focus on congregational participation with regards to the music in the church. The song leader's focus was to select and lead the congregation in singing, and maintaining a structured format. The song leader directed the congregation rather than fostering an interactive experience with God. Congregational participation was often passive, with worshippers following along instead of actively engaging in worship. By the late 1970's many churches moved from a song leader model of worship to a worship leader model. The worship leader encourages congregational participation but the main focus is for the worshippers to have an individual and spiritual connection with God in the worship service. There have been people in our congregation who have told me that they were so overcome by God's presence that they could not sing. Song services are no longer measured by congregational/vocal participation. Within this focus of a spiritual encounter with God there is space for us, in the holiness of God's presence, to sit in silence before the Lord and let His presence wash over us. There is an opportunity to confess sin and receive forgiveness. The hurting have the opportunity in worship to bring their burdens to God and receive healing. There is also space for the unsaved to be drawn to the cross to receive God's gift of salvation. There are no limits to what God will do!
