The words, "Fallen. Fallen" are called "proleptic aorists" or "prophetic preterit." A Greek aorist tense simply means that something happened. But this particular tense says that something in the future is so ______ that we can speak of it as already happened.

Answer: Per chapters 17 and 18 – it stands for both a ______ and a ______ that promotes or represents spiritual adultery/idolatry, i.e. Jerusalem (Preterist), Papal Rome (Historicist), an organized system that is anti-God (Idealist), revived Roman Empire with an undisclosed capital, or resurrected Babylon in Iraq (Futurist).
