A Closer Look at Genesis 1:1 and 2

 The word for "_____" in verse one is "bara" but in Exodus 20:11 it is "asah" and translated "made." There are those who will take this word to mean "_____" but the word seldom, if ever, means this. "Asah" is simply a synonym of "bara." Taken in its context and interpreted by Genesis 1:1, it means the same thing. Cf. Nehemiah 9:6 The word "_____," as found in Genesis 2:7, is the word, "assar" and is associated with something that already existed. Adam was made from the ______ of the ground not *Ex Nihilo*.

- 2. Genesis 1:2, "______..." The NIV chooses to translate the conjunction "and" differently to separate verse one from two. It does so on grammatical and _______ grounds. Most Hebrew scholars see in verse one a general statement that is a prelude to that which is to come. Verse two simply gives the reader or hearer a description of what the earth was like ______ to His forming. It does not, as the Gappists would have us believe, offer a validation for their theory.
- 3. "Hayetah" = "to be" or "_____," from the verb "Hayah."

Gappists translate this word as "_____," but the syntax keeps this from being true.

A simple explanation:

- a. "Became" = conjunction plus an imperfect verb (consecutive waw; this conveys "and" at the beginning of the sentence) plus a subject. This interpretation would allow something prior that was
 ______ destroyed. The translation would be, "And the earth became..." implying that it wasn't without form or empty when it was first created (primeval creation).
- b. "Was" = conjunction plus a subject plus a perfect verb (conversive waw with a perfect verb gives it a present or temporal sense instead of the past, e.g. "at this ______" or "now"). This is the syntax form of Genesis 1:2. Correct translation: "Now the earth was..." and simply states what its current condition was before God started to form it and further create.
- "Tohu" and "Bohu" = "Now the earth was ______ and _____." Gappists claim that these two words are associated with destruction and ______ which then fits into the Luciferian Flood/Judgment theory. Cf. Isaiah 34:11 and Jeremiah 4:23.

This may be true in the two cross reference contexts but not in all. Context drives the meaning. These are also known as "Verbal ______." An allusion is a reference to something ______ in order to give the current context meaning, not the other way around. Genesis 1:2 gives Isaiah and Jeremiah meaning. Isaiah and Jeremiah do not give Genesis 1:2 meaning.
